Lent is fast approaching. In the forty days (minus Sundays) leading to Easter, we are encouraged to enter the wilderness with Jesus. For some of us that means taking on the spiritual practice of fasting, for others of us that means adding some other spiritual practice that helps us ground ourselves in the Divine. In worship, we choose a theme, a lens through which we will explore the ancient stories that are so familiar to so many of us.

Hopefully we will spark conversation that will deepen our relationships with God and each other, and in the process we will discover that sharing this journey brings us closer to the Source of our Salvation.







Update on our IRS penalty issue: we haven't yet received an official communication from them. They did cash the check for the interest. I'm hoping to have a response from them on our request to waive the penalty later this month.

Currently, we have \$41,130 in the bank accounts. Our restricted funds account balance is \$22,595 which leaves us with \$18,535 as a buffer in our operating account. We have been able to fully fund the restricted funds balance as of the end of December 2023.



We do not have any new updates on the insurance claim. We know they are working on the claim itself. There were conversations with the forensic accountant assigned to our claim in December right before Christmas. We will update everyone once more information is available.
