#### **Mission Spending Plan**

#### **PUCC Strategic Planning**

Starting in the Fall, Council began working on developing a Strategic Plan for Pilgrimage. To begin our work, we had vision listening sessions for our church community both in person and virtually.

While a 'mission statement' defines an organization's business, its objectives, and how it will reach these objectives, a "vision statement" details where the organization aspires to go. Council prepared three vision statements. Prior to our meeting, your feedback was collected and presented during the meeting, which led to an enthusiastic discussion. As a result, a fourth option was established, and

this was the statement the majority of the members approved for our new PUCC Vision Statement.

scientists, they have talked about possible "tipping points," referring to problems such as sea level rise and melting glaciers, that could blindside us with irreversible changes. At least two such tipping points have already been passed. No matter what we do, we can't stop or control sea level rise nor the melting of the be approaching in the next few years or decades – scien-

natural absorber of greenhouse gas. When will it become unable to replenish itself, because of the burning and cutting of trees, and become a savanna that absorbs very little? Another is the fate of the Gulf Stream. It flows near Greenland, and fresh water from melting glaciers dilutes its saltiness, threatening to cause a change in its course. As it is, the path of this warm ocean current takes it near the coast of Ireland. If a change in course took it away, Britain's winters would resemble Denmark's or Norway's.

These threats and more like them add to the urgency of eliminating fossil fuels and stopping the creeping rise in the temperature of our atmosphere. But there's new hope. The Pew organization has completed a poll asking people in four countries, including the U.S., to consider a list of problems and dangers and to place them in their order of importance. In a remarkable turn-around from previous polls, more than seventy percent placed climate change at the top of the list. Of course, far too many members of Congress don't agree, but if an overwhelming majority of their constituents do, then most of them will surely come around.
