Dear Beloved,

Somehow, we have blown right past Halloween and Thanksgiving and are staring down yet another mad rush to Christmas. Outside our sanctuary, the world insists on putting on a happy face and making everything merry and bright. But for too many of us, that is not the world we live in—not now, maybe not ever. Year after year, I watch people I love get crushed by the high hopes of the holidays that get dashed by reality: illness, economic insecurity, family tensions, political fears.

So inside our congregation, as we worship this Advent, we are using a series from *A Sanctified Art*, a collective of clergy who approach the season with a hope grounded in reality rather than the wishful thinking of popular culture and consumerism. The theme is called "Words for the Beginning," and here is how the good people at *A Sanctified Art* describe it:

Advent is a season of endings and beginnings. As the calendar year comes to a close, a new church year begins. Christ's birth ushers us into new ways of living and loving; and yet, the world as we know it spins madly on. In many ways, pregnant Mary was surrounded by endings—large and small, personal and political. But Mary proclaimed hope in a God who was and is making all things new. Christ's birth offered a beautiful new beginning for shepherds and Magi alike—all the while, King Herod tried to bring Christ's story to an end. When we ourselves navigate seasons filled

with endings and beginnings, we need reminders.

We need words that can feel like steady ground,
like a path for our feet to find as we step
forward into the unknown.

We have crafted an Advent series filled with blessings, with the scriptures and reminders we need to hear again and again as we begin a new season. These reminders root us in the fundamental truths of our faith. Many of them are life lessons we teach to children—lessons that adults continue to learn and relearn. They may resemble the blessings we impart to loved ones during special ceremonies like weddings, graduations, or baptisms. And so, we invite you to move through this Advent season as if you are entering a sacred new chapter, holding fast to the reminders that will bolster you for the journey ahead.

We will root ourselves in ancient words, in rich art to draw us into the story, in traditions and practices that keep us close to God. On Dec. 19, we will have our Blue Christmas worship service at 7PM. On Christmas Eve, we will have our family service and children's pageant at 5 and our Lessons and Carols at 10. No matter how the season finds us, the light of Christ will dawn again in our midst. God continues to make all things new.

Have a blessed Advent and a Merry Christmas, dear ones.

God loves you, and so do I.

Advent(ure)

One of my favorite characters in the movie My Big Fat We are called to be boldly humble, and to dare and risk, Greek Wedding is Toula's father, Gus. Beside his quirky belief in Windex as an all purposeful healing treatment, he enjoyed sharing his belief that most words have their root in a Greek word. As we enter the season of Advent we reflect on the meaning of the Greek word for Advent as the "coming" or "arrival".

And to fully appreciate the "coming" it helps to be mindful of the context of what proceeded the "arrival". One, we celebrated and gave thanks for our blessings during Thanksgiving and presumably put us on a path of continuing gratitude. Two, a journey or adventure (think of Joseph's and Mary's trip to Bethlehem) precedes the "arrival". Of course, scripture records many journeys and adventures of the faithful.

The Greek meaning of the word 'adventure' is to risk or dare. In this time for Pilgrimage, we have the opportunity to risk and dare for a greater, more loving ministry as we, the congregation, decide our path for the thoughtful use of the insurance funds.

During the November meeting, the Council arrived at a consensus plan for the allocation of these funds. "Champions" for each of the projects or categories have been set and the additional details are being developed so a clear path forward may be presented to the congregation for review and approval at our Annual Financial Meeting in January, tentatively for January 19, 2025.

Progress continues in other business before the Executive Committee and Council:

- Agreement to engage QuickBooks Accounting Services to provide third-party bookkeeping and reporting activities.
 - Lowest cost of three services.
 - Access to QuickBooks Online software by three Pilgrimage Officers.
 - Significant reduction in labor required by our Treasurers to allow more time for man-

- agement/oversight of finances.
- Includes assignment of bookkeeping specialist and advice from OuickBooks.
- Will replace current accounting software and 3rd party payroll service – all integrated in one platform and electronic syncing of account data.
- Added agreement with our current fire extinguisher service provider to also cover the inspection & certification of our emergency lighting - compliance with fire regulations.
- Collecting budget requests from the committees and other sources to properly develop a draft for the 2025 Mission Spending plan for the Annual Financial Meeting in January.



Based on the financial reports provided, here are some key trends for Pilgrimage United Church of Christ for October and Year-to-Date:

- 1. Overall Financial Position: The church is showing a positive year-to-date net total of \$1,703.75.
- 2. Pledged Giving Status: While October's pledged giving was under budget by \$1,372.61 (actual \$15,430.39 vs budgeted \$16,803.00), the year-to-date pledged giving is actually exceeding budget by \$2,894.39 (actual \$170,924.39 vs budgeted \$168,030.00), showing strong overall commitment from the congregation.
- 3. Cost Savings in Properties: Year-to-date property expenses are significantly under budget by \$5,915.60 (actual \$47,791.63 vs budgeted \$53,707.23), helping offset some revenue shortfalls in other areas.
- 4. Staff Compensation Efficiency: The total staff compensation is running very close to budget with a variance of only \$848.86 over the year-to-date budget (\$111,627.51 actual vs \$112,476.37 budgeted). This shows strong payroll management and accurate budgeting for personnel costs.

At the end of October, we had \$52,493.79 in our bank accounts. Our restricted funds account balance is \$27,995.61, leaving us with a balance of \$24,498.18 in our Operating Funds. Our Restricted Funds Balance details are shown below:



The insurance payments were deposited into interest-bearing accounts in March. Our initial deposit was \$542,460.98. Through October, we earned \$15,643.33 of interest, and our current balance is \$558,104.31. All treasurer-related requests should be sent to pilgrimageucctreasurer@gmail.com.
