Interim Pastor's Message *by Rev. Phil Price*

What can we learn from Fern?

The storm named Fern blew through last week and upended many plans and expectations.

We had planned that January 25 be my first Sunday at Pilgrimage and would be the Sunday that many of us would meet for the first time. Those plans had to be adjusted as the forecast called for icy conditions such that going to church could be dangerous. The church leadership decided that the "plan" was not worth the risk, so the plan was changed.

Storms happen. We adjust. Life goes on. There is no, "storm free existence." Storms of this kind are not personal. There is no one individual, or group, who "sinned" that is the cause of this storm. Earthquakes, tornadoes, wildfires, floods and volcanoes are no longer understood to be actions of the gods, meted out as expressions of anger or punishment.

I am reminded of the storm that the disciples got caught in while crossing a lake. Jesus was asleep in the boat. The faith lesson we learn from that story is that faith is the essential quality that helps us get through the storm, rather than the power to make the storm go away.

Storms happen. Faith is what it takes to get through it.

Here are a few other things that help.

Preparation matters: No matter what storm you are going through, preparation matters. We had about a week's warning on this one. We had time to prepare for power outages. (I got my gen-set ready to go.) We had time to prepare for disruptions in food and gasoline supply. Without equivocation, those who were better prepared, fared better. The Boy Scout motto is a good one.

Flexibility matters: Plans are good, but they are based on assumptions. As what is assumed changes, plan must change accordingly. This is not wish-washy, this is wisdom.

Storms are learning opportunities. Never waste a good storm. They come pre-loaded with advanced level learning opportunities. It is a sad reality that many folks take many storms to learn undergrad level truths and often have to repeat courses that could have been passed either by reading or by a single experience.

Transition time is hardly a storm level experience, but there are some similarities. Transition times happen regularly. There is no one to blame and most times, they are no one's "fault."

Preparation, planning, execution, wise choices, all come into play and very much determine outcome.

Flexibility. The capacity to pay attention to what is happening and to adjust accordingly is crucial.

Having faith. Knowing that we have been called to "get to the other side." This means that no matter what storms we face, we will trust, and we will do what is necessary to fulfill that to which we have been called.

I am very excited about getting to know you, to facing storms together, to celebrating life with you, and to being faithful to our joint call to serve the interests to this church, and the possibility of God's reign on earth!
