PUCC Voting Rights Initiative Update As of March 27, 2024

In response to the fall 2023 survey of PUCC, Voting Rights was the 2nd highest priority for our congregation to address social justice issues. The new 2024 PUCC Voting Initiative is about to begin!

The GA primary election for U.S. President was on Tues, Mar 12. Primaries for ALL other elected officials (for local, county, state, & Federal) in GA is on Tues, May 21.

The PUCC Voting Rights Initiative as of now will focus on getting out the vote of all GA citizens by writing post cards, phone calling, perhaps sending texts, etc. Please share your ideas for other ways we can have a positive impact on community participation in voting. We will also be notifying folks of important dates and events such as candidate forums where the people running for office in your districts, precincts, etc. will be answering your questions.

Our first event, a Postcard Writing Party, will be on Wed, April 3, at 7pm at the church. Ann Baker will bring all the materials needed as well as some food and drinks. Anyone who wants to bring snacks and drinks is invited to do so. Also, if you have Forever stamps or any 53 cent stamps to donate, please bring them.

Here are some notes on the February YTD expense variances:

Through February, giving is roughly \$10,000 ahead of schedule. There may be other months that come in lower but so far, we're doing quite well.


Pastor expenses are high due to the full program fees for her study program coming due in February. Those expenses were planned evenly through the year.

Properties expenses are low due primarily due to planned special projects that haven't begun yet. Spending may pick up in later months.

Worship expenses are low primarily due to not yet staffing for the planned A/V role.

Communications, Admin & Office expenses are low due to the computer purchase coming in lower than planned.

At the end of February, we had \$51,942 in our bank accounts. Our restricted funds account balance is \$21,365 leaving us with a balance of \$30,577 in our Operating Funds. Our Restricted Funds Balance details are shown below:



As you are all aware, the Insurance Claim has now been paid. We received two checks, one for \$350,000 and one for \$192,460.98. They were received in March and will be shown in reports starting next month. They are going into new insured, interest bearing accounts so their reporting will be separate from the Operating Fund and the Restricted Fund accounts.

Update on our IRS penalty issue: I called them back in early February and determined that we needed to send our request to waive the penalty to a different address than where I sent the documentation in December. I created another letter and attached all previous correspondence and documentation and sent it out certified mail on Friday February 2. If the penalty is not waived, we will still owe approximately \$4,045. We have received a letter dated February 13, 2024 that states they haven't resolved the matter and will contact us within 60 days with our reply. I will update everyone once more information is available.
