This year marks the 75th Anniversary of the One Great Hour of Sharing special Lenten offering. OGHS is one of 4 special mission offerings of the United Church of Christ.

Part of Our Church's Wider Mission is the special mission offering of the United Church of Christ that carries God's message of love and hope to people in crisis. The UCC works with international partners to provide sources of clean water, food, education and health care, small business micro-credit, advocacy and resettlement for refugees and displaced persons, and emergency relief and rehabilitation. One Great Hour of Sharing also supports domestic and international ministries for disaster preparedness and response.

Specifically, the UCC supports sustainable development and refugee needs internationally and provides disaster relief and immigration assistance in the United States. The United Church of Christ responds as a member of organizations such as Church World Service and the ACT Alliance. We also support the direct mission efforts of churches and church-based organizations that the United Church of Christ and the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) have direct partnerships with through Global Ministries. Nearly one-fifth of the UCC's OGHS offering is shared through Church World Service to support refugees, and disaster programs worldwide.



Here are some notes on the January expense variances:

- Our payment for the January electric bill actually hit in late December which is why we look favorable for that item.
- Office Supplies is missing the Great America Financial Services bill which hit on February 1. That amount is \$135.54. We will see that picked up in February reports.
- ◆ Pastor dues, travel & learning is high due to Courtney's travel to Dallas this week coupled with a lost payment to her in December. We have received the \$700 back from the bank as of February 1 so we'll see a credit there in February reports.
- Payroll Processing is high due to year end work related to W-2 reporting.

At the end of January, we had \$57,747 in our bank accounts. Our restricted funds account balance is \$23,157 leaving us with a balance of \$34,590 in our Operating Funds. Our Restricted Funds Balance details are shown below:



Update on our IRS penalty issue: I called them back in early February and determined that we needed to send our request to waive the penalty to a different address than where I sent the documentation in December. I created another letter and attached all previous correspondence and documentation and sent it out certified mail on Friday February 2. If the penalty is not waived, we will still owe approximately \$4,045. We have received a letter dated February 13, 2024 that states they haven't resolved the matter and will contact us within 60 days with our reply. I will update everyone once more information is available.

2024 Tax Reporting update: All employees have been provided with their W-2s and those have also been filed with the IRS. We have also filed the one required 1099 through a service called Tax1099.com. We have confirmation that the IRS has accepted our electronic filing, and the individual also received their 1099 before the end of January.

We are working to implement a new accounting tool called Realm. This tool will be used for Giving reports as well as Income/Expense reports once we have it all up and running. This means there may be changes in the reporting formats as we move through the next few months. We will do our best to explain changes as they are rolled out. This month's reports were completed using the old method. The new tool will allow for easier oversight of our funds. It's a cloud-based tool so it won't reside on just one person's computer. This should make it easier for us to transition the work as people move in and out of our financial roles at the church.
