ear Beloved, How can it be that it's already November?! The days are getting shorter, the nights are getting chillier, and we are barreling toward the holiday season.

But as we sit in this liminal (in-between) space, in the trinity of days that are Halloween—All Souls Day—All Saints Day, I invite us to pause. To be in this moment rather than thinking ahead. Breathe deeply, and drink in the crisp air. Feel how fast and slow time seems to move all at once: somehow, an hour can feel like an eternity, and a year passes in the blink of an eye.

In these holy days, we honor the thin veil between life and the realm of the eternal (which we might call Heaven, or the Realm of God, or the vastness of the Universe, or something else). Throughout history, the Church has used these "thin" days to reflect on the unending relationship between the living and the dead, which is sometimes referred to as the "communion of saints." In October, one of our living saints, Steve Owens, died to this life and entered into God's eternal communion. And yet, death is not the end of our relationship with Steve, nor with serve, please contact Dick and Rita Mehlan at: any of our beloved ones who have slipped this life. At the same time, we get to recognize this life, and this moment, for what it is—a single moment that will fade into memory, another moment when the

future becomes the present and the present becomes the past. I hope this inspires awe and wonder more than fear or regret! We are called to notice God's movement in the world and to join our energy with the energy of the Divine; in these liminal days, there is no better time to tap into the aspects of the Sacred that are mysterious, unable to be fully known. What wisdom comes to us from beyond the veil when we open ourselves to the lessons of this liminal time?

There will be time to prepare for Thanksgiving. There will be time to prepare our homes and our sanctuary and our hearts for God's miraculous entry into the world. But for today, our only job is to be present, to breathe, to understand that we are part of the divine mystery that is ever-unfolding. I pray that God's peace will be with you this season and always.

CLIMATE CHANGE – A Christian Concern

Recently, I reported on China's efforts to slow climate change. Now I have found an excellent article from *Foreign Affairs*, on that subject. It only expresses opinion but is well researched and thoughtful – a worthy effort. I will summarize its message. An important consideration from other sources is that Xi Jinping's term in office has been extended. He may become a life-long autocrat.

We know that, in our country, personal ambitions and party loyalties of powerful people often dominate, leaving us at the mercy of climate change. So it isn't hard to accept that a similar situation might exist in China. The opinion in *Foreign Affairs* is that the primary focus of Chinese leaders is to keep their enormous population satisfied and compliant with their rule, to maintain their power. A smoothly functioning economy is a necessity for this purpose.

The hundreds of coal-fired power plants in China are, unlike ours, their lowest cost source of power. These plants, many new, have a 40-to-50 year lifespan. I previously reported that China has this year established a cap-and-trade emission control system for coal plants, but it applies to a disappointingly small number of them.

The Foreign Affairs authors' position, as stated above, is that China, earth's largest greenhouse gas emitter, will not conduct meaningful negotiations on climate control. Unified action by nations with significant trade volumes with China, however, could apply heavy economic pressure. If China's trading partners each adopted a carbon tax with border adjustment, China's carbon-containing exports would be taxed by each trading country an amount equal to its carbon tax, at its border. Carbon taxes increase annually. This would continue until China adopted a similar carbon tax. Several countries already tax carbon, and such a tax is reportedly under consideration for inclusion in the Democrats' reconciliation bill.
